Bangor Elks ENF Giving Report

A few months ago, we published an article in our newsletter on the Elks National Foundation and how this foundation not only helps our youth, communities, and veterans, but how it helps our lodge in supporting these causes by giving us grants. We noted that the Per Capita per lodge was \$4.85 per member. For the 2016-17 lodge year, Bangor Lodge Contributed a total of \$2505 to the Elks National Foundation. This included individual donations of \$405.00 and a lodge donation of \$2100. This gave us a Per Capita of \$5.506 per member. This is great news as our lodge is now eligible to continue receiving grant money from the ENF for our local charitable causes. Last year we received \$4000 in grants from the Community Investment Program and we plan to once again apply for these grants plus an additional grant to help our Veterans. Thank you to all Bangor Elks that contributed to this great cause.

Smoking in the Lodge

Over the last several weeks there have been some questions regarding the smoking policy of the lodge. As a reminder, the smoking policy is governed by the Pennsylvania Clean Indoor Air Act which was adopted in 2008 and enforced by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board. As a private club, we were to set our own areas as designated smoking areas in our lodge. Our house rules were set up that the banquet hall would always be the non-smoking area of our lodge. In addition, the Act also states that whenever there is a rental or event open to the public, the entire building must be non-smoking. This is not a club rule or bartenders rule, but a regulation that is enforced by the PLCB. Our house committee also set up that smoking be prohibited in the bar area during Friday Evening dinners between 5:00 PM and 8:00 PM. We ask that all members help us maintain this policy so we are not caught with a surprise citation and fine from the PLCB.

Lodge Budget

As per our statutes, the annual budget of the lodge must be submitted to the lodge by the second meeting in April and be voted on and adopted at that meeting or the next regularly scheduled meeting. Our second meeting will be April 19 and we encourage any interested members to attend this meeting to see and vote where your lodge funds are spent.

AED/CPR Training

On Sunday March 26, members and staff of our lodge were trained in CPR and the operation of a recently installed A.E.D. in the lodge. We want to thank the lodge for the purchase of the AED, Todd McLain for the installation of the A.E.D. and House Committee Chairman Corey Genteel for finding us batteries and arranging the classes.



Drug Awareness

Our Drug Awareness Committee meets the first Tuesday of every month at 7:00 PM at the lodge. The committee, has been asked by several community organizations to have our trailer and Elroy at their events over the summer. If you are interested in becoming a member of this committee and getting involved to help spread the antidrug message to our local youth, just come to any of the meetings. The next scheduled meeting is May 2.

Pennsylvania Major Project Honored Child of the Year

He attends 7th grade Life Skills Class at Rocky Grove High School. Dylan uses a manual wheelchair and a walker at school. Dylan received a modified bike which he uses at school as part of his Physical Therapy during the winter months and uses at home during the summer months. Dylan is diagnosed with Hydrocephalus and Epilepsy, and Patty began working with the PA Elks Home Service Program soon after his birth to help her connect with services. Over the years, Patty has worked with Dorothy Fornof and Peggy Phillips, and now Amanda Davis is her Elks Nurse. Patty and her

husband enjoy outdoor activities and have gotten a fourwheeler to share that love with Dylan. Dylan enjoys participating in the Super Kids Soap Box Derby, and he has finished in the top ten at least twice.



Dylan also loves to swim, watch hockey and football on TV, and play games on his I Pad. He also enjoys watching Everybody Love Raymond with his family. Dylan loves the American Flag, and loves to hold it and wave it, so he is really going to enjoy the Patriotism that is an integral part of the Elks Spring Con-
